Speaking of rookies, AD's Danny Silva came through with a clutch hit while HT's Joe Wolfinger (4/4, 2 Dbls, 4 RBIs) was perfect at the plate and his teammate, Jeff Vaka with 2 doubles and an RBI hit the ball so hard he literally knocked over a couple of fielders and on a sinking line drive to left field he made a spectacular, diving 'miss,' but oh was it ever impressive.

How about the rest of Argyle Dental? Jim Hupp (3/4, Trip, RBI) had 6 put outs & gapped HT for a triple. Tim Williams was 3 for 3 and Jerry Hinson was 3 for 4 with 4 RBIs. There was a play in the 6th inning involving two ladies and two men; Louis Berthold called out something about 'Little Sexy.' As the teams traded the field I asked Louis, "Who you calling sexy?" He said, "Flatt, he's 'Little Sexy,' but I'm still 'Big Sexy'. I was so stunned by the incongruity of those two monikers that I didn't even have a comeback. But it is no longer 'Chief' Flatt, instead 'Little Sexy,' 'Little Sexy' Flatt and Mike Jaensch
