In an effort to maintain a competitive balance for games and to remain in line with bat performance specifications used by Centex Tournament Series play, Town & Country Baseball will be adjusting bat compliance requirements for all age groups.

This rule change will take effect beginning with the Spring 2020 season:

Rules for all Leagues (see below for league specific rules):

- A bat labeled with either of a BBCOR, 1.15BPF stamp or the official USA Baseball Stamp (USABat) can be any length/weight ratio
- A bat 2 ¼ in diameter is allowable and does not need the aforementioned stamp and can be any length/weight ratio
- Any bat without the aforementioned stamp/label and larger than 2 ¼ inches in diameter (e.g. 2 5/8, 2 ¾), the length to weight ratio must be equal to or heavier than minus 10
 - For example:
 - If length is 30 inches, weight must be 20 oz
 - -10, -9, -8, -7, -6 or -5 would be acceptable length to weight ratios whereas 11, -12 and -13 would not.
 - Exception for 14u league, which must be drop 8 or heavier (noted below)
- The official bat shall be round in cross section for the entire length of the barrel and smooth surfaced in the hitting area.
 - Axe branded baseball bats are allowable if have stamp or meet length/weight requirement
- The maximum length shall not exceed thirty-six (36) inches.
- The bat shall be constructed of wood, aluminum, or any other material or combination of materials as defined for baseball bats by ASTM standards.
- Any material to improve the grip may be used for a distance not to exceed eighteen (18) inches from the handle end.
- All bats must be commercially manufactured for baseball play.
- Softball bats or bats altered after manufacture to reduce or add weight will not be allowed.

4U, 6U, 8U leagues:

- The maximum diameter shall NOT exceed two and five eights (2 5/8) inches.
- A bat with 2 ¾ inch diameter barrel is NOT acceptable in these leagues.

10u, 12u leagues:

The maximum diameter shall NOT exceed two and three fourths (2 ½) inches.

14u leagues:

- All bats must be equal to or heavier than minus 8 in length to weight ratio.
 - o For example: -8, -5, -3 are acceptable length to weight ratios and -10 is not
