JBO will be governed by the NFHS Rulebook as amended by the OSAA, except as otherwise indicated in the JBO Rulebook. These rules will be in effect for League, District, and JBO State Tournament Games.

OREGON SENATE BILL 721

Requires all coaches to be trained to identify concussions in players. This is an online or in-person class certification. At least one trained adult must be present at all practices and games in order to hold any activity.

JBO requires that, prior to participating in any “JBO Inc.” sanctioned events, all adults, those persons in any way assisting, volunteering, and in direct contact with the payers, including but not limited to coaches, assistant coaches, umpires, or similar positions, must pass a comprehensive criminal background screening. These background screenings must be done each year.



Minimum number of players on each roster is 11. In addition, teams entering JBO State Tournament must bring a roster of 11 eligible players that have played 50% of league games or provide the appropriate "Player/Team Waiver Form." Any player on a team must have played at least 50% of the team's league games in order to participate in the JBO State Tournament.

All Federal teams will have a legal 11-player roster, as there are no waivers for less than an 11-player roster.

A youth may NOT play on more than one team in Junior Baseball in any one year unless the family moves and becomes bona fide residents of another association (Must be approved by JBO)

COACHES-You can NOT pull players from another team to help fill your roster for any league games. If your team falls below the roster limit on game day, you will need to reschedule. If you use a player from another team, your game is a forfeit.

If a player/coach is ejected by an official for unsportsmanlike conduct, the incident must be reported to the District Commissioner and JBO President prior to the player's/coach's next contest.

**Ejected coaches or spectators must leave the contest immediately.

**Ejected players must remain on the bench for the duration of that contest.

It is the responsibility of the Association to ensure the DC and JBO President are notified, and the ejected player/coach is disallowed from participating in the next contest.

When players are being "benched" for disciplinary reasons, the opposing coach and umpire must be notified prior to the start of the game. Players must attend the contest to serve the penalty. If the player does not attend the next applicable contest to serve the penalty, the suspension will continue to apply until the player has attended and has been benched for the entire contest.

A second ejection for unsportsmanlike conduct will result in a two-game suspension and a third will result in disqualification from further participation in JBO. Any physical contact between a player, coach, spectator, and/or an official is a gross act of unsportsmanlike conduct. The offending parties will immediately be ejected and suspended for a minimum of two contests.

THE PLAYER AND COACH MUST ALWAYS SERVE THE SUSPENSION REQUIRED!

PLAYERS BENCHES ARE RESERVED FOR THE PLAYERS, COACHES, AND SCOREKEEPER, AND IT IS THE DUTY OF THE OFFICIALS TO ENFORCE THIS RULE.

NO PLAYER, COACH, FAN, OR PARENT SHALL DELAY A GAME BY UNNECESSARY BICKERING OR USE OF ABUSIVE AND/OR PROFANE LANGUAGE.

NO USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS, E-CIGARETTES, ALCOHOL, OR DRUGS WILL BE TOLERATED BY ANY COACH, PLAYER, FAN, PARENT, OR UMPIRE DURING GAMES ON THE FIELD.

THE HEAD COACH IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE CONDUCT OF HIS/HER PLAYERS, ASSISTANT COACHES, PARENTS, AND FANS AT ALL TIMES!

Clackamas County Junior Baseball Association (CCJBA)

MINOR DIVISION

- Bases are to be 60 feet apart and pitching distance is 45 feet.
- Two adult coaches may coach on the bases, provided an approved adult is on the bench for supervision. Gameplay may be stopped until an approved adult is in the dugout.
- Games are completed after five innings, 4 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. Due to weather or darkness, three innings constitutes a legal game, 2 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. If a legal game is completed, both teams have not had an equal number of complete turns at bat, but the home team has scored a go-ahead run in the bottom of the inning, the final score is recorded. Please see Section VIII. Letter U for continuation rule, and Letter W for ties.
- For **National** skill level, no new inning will start after two hours of playing time even if the result of the game is a tie.
- Batting helmets must be worn while on the playing field. If the ball is live, players may not remove their helmets while on the field. Upon the first offense, both teams are warned; upon the second, an out is declared. Enforcement of this rule never results in an ejection.
- Every eligible player must play a minimum of six defensive outs in all legal games, the bottom half of the un-played final inning does not count towards this requirement.
- There will be a five-run rule per inning with the final inning open. The umpire must declare, prior to the start of any inning, that this is the final inning, based on the following conditions: time restriction, field condition, darkness, or the fifth inning (for ties, see rule VIII Letter W)
- For **National** skill level, for a carelessly thrown bat, at the end of playing action, the umpire will issue a warning to the coach of the team in violation and the next offending batter on that team will immediately be called out. There will be no ejection for a carelessly thrown bat. The immediate ejection for maliciously thrown bat is still in effect.
- For **National** and **American** skill levels, the batter is out regardless of whether the third strike is caught or not.
- For the **National** skill level, a runner may not lead off third base and may not steal home. A runner on third may only advance as a result of a batted ball, walk, or penalty.

JUNIOR DIVISION

- Bases are to be 70 feet apart and pitching distance is 50 feet.
- Games are to be complete after six innings, 5 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. Due to weather or darkness, four innings constitutes a legal game, 3 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. If a legal game is completed, both teams have not had an equal number of complete turns at bat, but the home team has scored a go-ahead run in the bottom of the inning, the final score is recorded. Please see section VIII. Letter U for continuation rule, and Letter W for ties.
- For **National** skill level, no new inning will start after two hours of playing time even if the result of the game is a tie.
- Batting helmets must be worn while on the playing field. If the ball is live players may not remove their helmets while on the playing field. Upon the first offense, both teams are warned; upon the second, an out is declared. Enforcement of this rule never results in an ejection.
- I. Every eligible player must play a minimum of six defensive outs in all legal games, bottom half of the un-played final inning does not count towards this requirement.
- J. For **National** skill level there will be a five-run rule per inning, with the final inning open. The umpire must declare, prior to the start of any inning, that this is the final inning, based on the following conditions: time restriction, field condition, darkness, or the sixth inning (for ties, see rule VIII Letter W).



Clackamas County Junior Baseball Association (CCJBA)

Senior Division

- Bases are to be 90 feet apart for all skill levels and pitching distance is 60 feet 6 inches for all skill levels.
- Games are completed after seven innings, 6 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. Due to weather or darkness, five innings constitutes a legal game, 4 ½ innings if the home team is ahead. If a legal game is completed, both teams have not had an equal number of complete turns at bat, but the home team has scored a go-ahead run in the bottom of the inning, the final score is recorded. Please see section VIII. Letter U for continuation rule, and Letter W for ties.
- For **ALL Senior** skill levels, no new inning will start after two hours 15 minutes playing time, even if the result of the game is a tie.
- Steel cleats are allowed for Senior Division play. Check with other coaches as most turn fields don't allow steel.
- Every eligible player must play a minimum of 9 defensive outs by the completion of the 7th inning. The bottom half of the un-played final inning does not count towards this requirement. Every eligible player must play in a minimum of 6 defensive outs in all other legal games.
- J. For **National** skill level, there will be a 5-run rule per inning, with the final inning being open. The umpire must declare, prior to the start of any inning, that this is the final inning, based on the following conditions: time restriction, field condition, darkness, or the seventh inning (for ties, see rule VIII. Letter W).



Clackamas County Junior Baseball Association (CCJBA)

- Each home team is responsible for furnishing two (2) new good quality baseballs for each game.
- All rainouts or game cancellations must be rescheduled within seven (7) days. The home team must give three dates to the visiting team. If both teams cannot agree on a date, then after the third day the teams must contact their area heads to help facilitate a reschedule.
The game must be played before the season is over!
- The home team association is responsible for scheduling and paying umpires. An umpire no show cannot result in a forfeit and the game is to be rescheduled.



Clackamas County Junior Baseball Association (CCJBA)

- Rescheduling regular season games
 - Area heads must be involved
 - Once both teams and areas heads agree - home area head must email schedules@ccjbaoregon.com with details.
 - Make sure to include league #, team names, and dates in request.

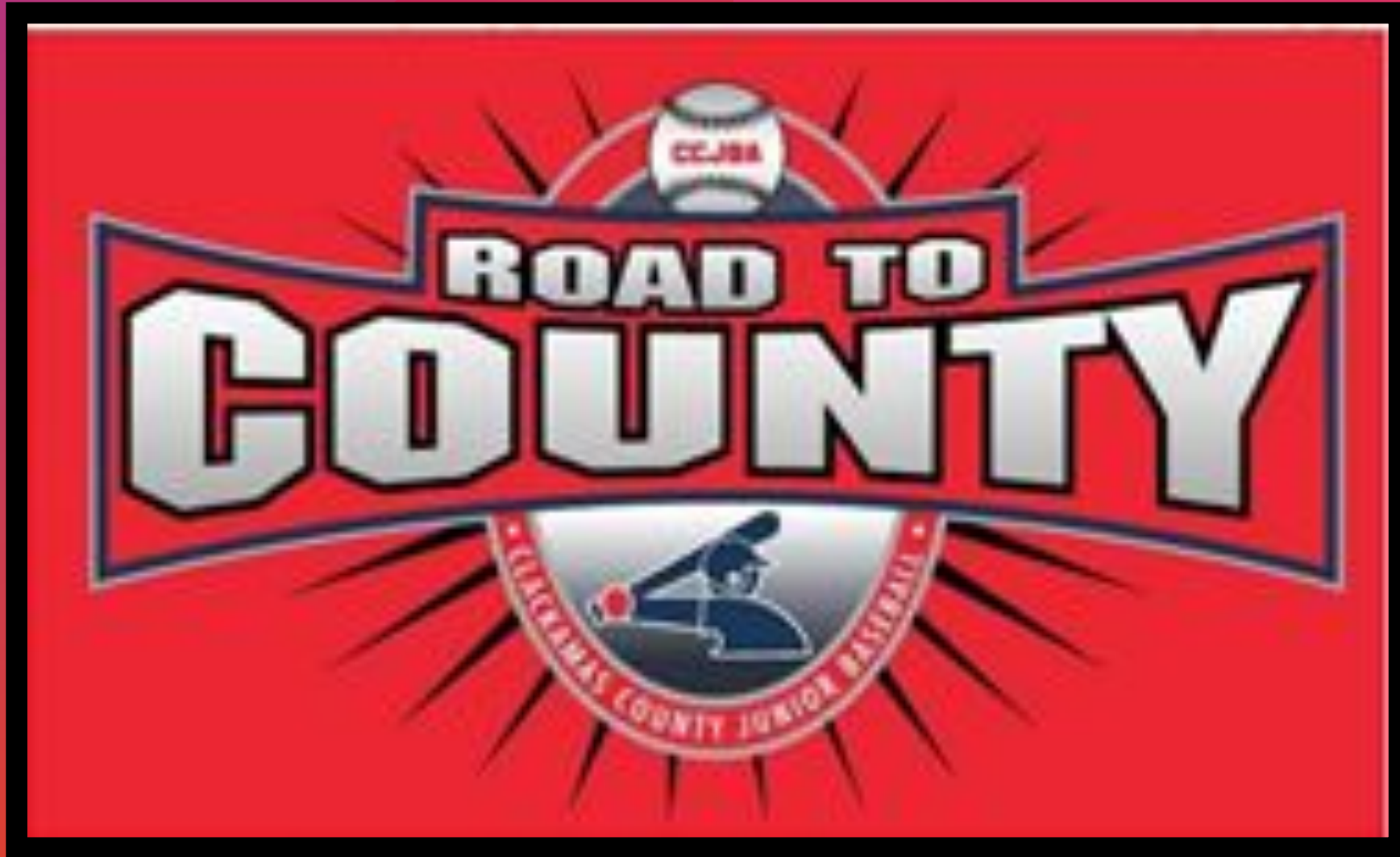
