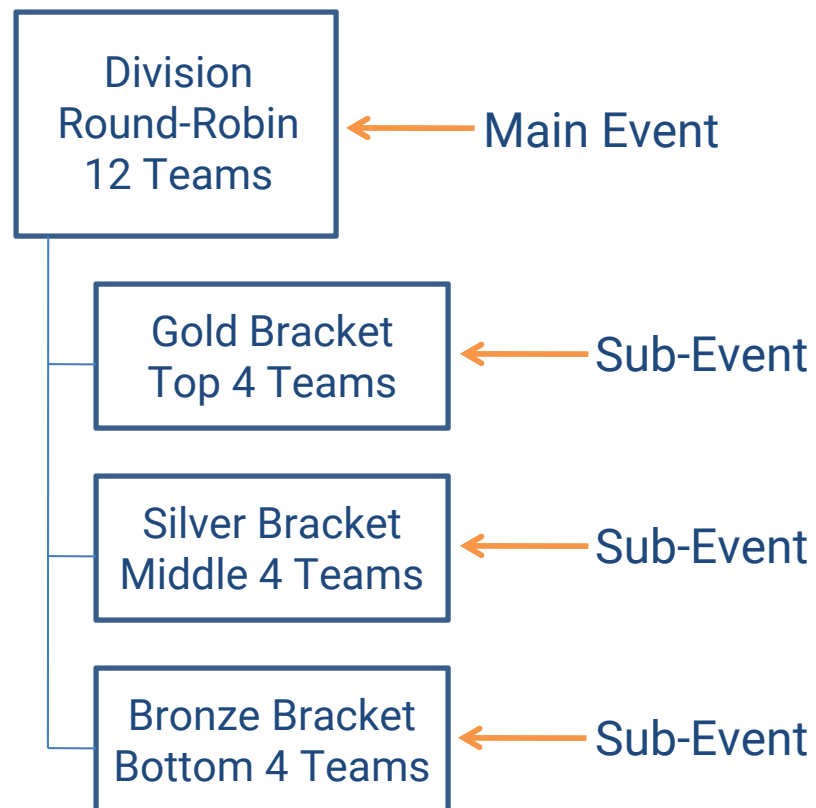

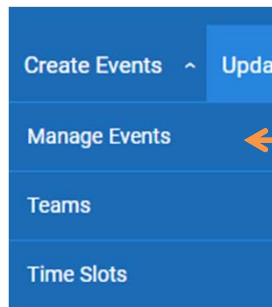
# Sub-Events

- QuickScores allows users to easily create pages that include standings, league, or round-robin schedules and brackets on a single page making it convenient for participants to view their league or division.
- Sometimes it is desirable to have multiple brackets in the playoffs for a single division. Other times it is desirable to create a single bracket as a playoff from multiple divisions. Sub-Events allow you to do both of these things.
- Example 1 is a single league or division, followed by multiple brackets.
- Example 2 is two leagues (or divisions) that feed two shared brackets, with teams from each league going into shared brackets. The brackets are shown with each league, but are built and maintained in one place. This example can be done with one or more brackets.
- Sub-Events should not be used to include multiple leagues or divisions into a single event or page. The resulting page can be very long and thus be inconvenient for participants. Instead, create a new Season for each tournament or season, then create each division or league as a separate Event.

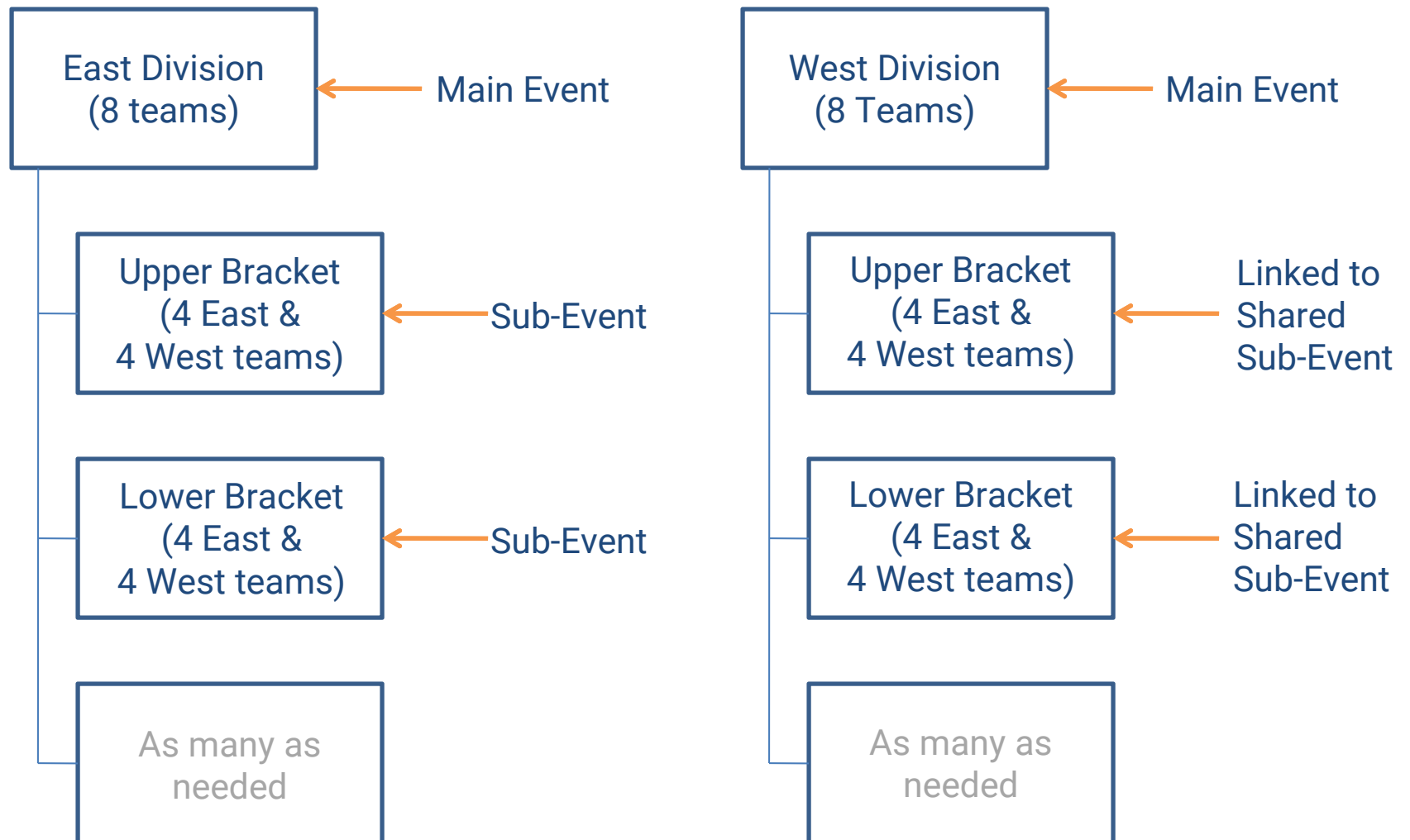

## Example 2 - Two divisions with Shared Brackets






## 2a – Basic Steps (Example 2)

- Create the first main event (East on the previous slide) with one or more sub-events exactly as in Example 1.
- Create the second main event (West on the previous slide).
- Add sub-events the second main events, but define these sub-events as “linked” to the first sub-events.
- Linking allows you to display a bracket in multiple events, while only maintaining it in one, thus eliminating the need to enter results multiple times!

## 2b - Link to Brackets (Example 2)

When on the sub-events page of the second main event, instead of creating new events, use the **Choose a current event** drop-down selector to choose the sub-events from the first main event.

Then click **Save Sub-Events**.



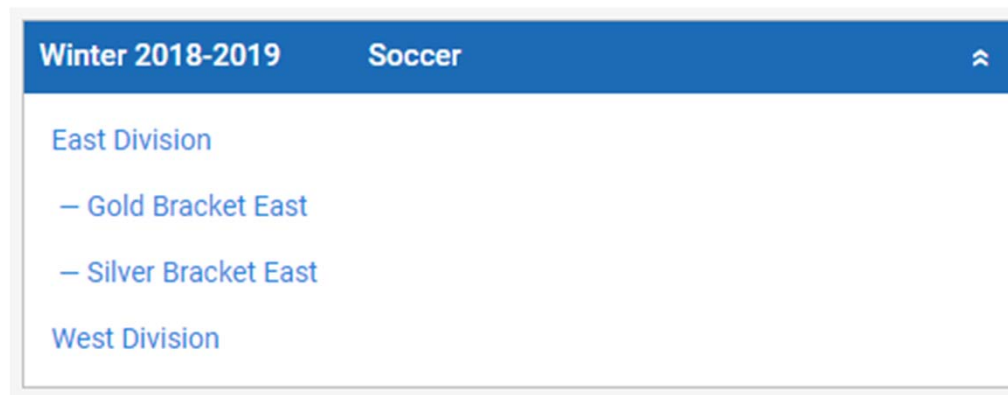

## 3b - Create Bracket (Example 2)

Click on one of the Sub-Events  
under the first main event



Notice that the initial “real” Sub-Events are shown, while the linked Sub-Events are not shown. Any changes made to real East sub-events will instantly be reflected to the linked West Division sub-events.

Manually edit the seeds to alternate between the different divisions, as shown here.

When the round-robin play is done, the real team names will need to be manually copied into the list of seeds.
