

**LORAIN COUNTY SOCCER LEAGUE
BY-LAWS
ADDENDUM #2
EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025**

This Addendum was created for the Registration By-Laws to address clarification needed based on questions raised during previous seasons.

The following addendum replaces LCSL By-Laws, Article V, LCSL Specific Rules, Section A. Registration, subsection #5 and adds subsection #6.

ARTICLE V

L.C.S.L. SPECIFIC RULES

A. Registration

5. Dual Rostering – LCSL does not allow guest players in games. All players must be rostered and approved by the LCSL Registrar to play in an LCSL sanctioned game. Dual Rostering is allowed in the following scenarios:
 - i. Players can be dual rostered up 2 age groups apart from U11. A U11 player can dual roster up to U14 due to LCSL not having a U13 division. If LCSL ever has a U13 division, U11 would only be allowed to roster up to U13.

***LCSL highly recommends dual rostering U11 to U14 be done based on the skill level, not to fill a team, due to the age gap between these divisions.*
 - ii. Dual roster to a higher division within the same age group. For example, U10B player can dual roster up to U10A. However, U10A players cannot roster down to U10B. Additionally, U10B players should not dually roster to another U10B team.
 - iii. Players that are Club players cannot be dual rostered to two LCSL teams.
6. Ohio Travel Soccer League (OHTSL) players – defined as a player rostered with LCSL and OHTSL for the season.
 - i. OHTSL players in combination with Club players (see By-Laws, Section A, subsection 2) cannot exceed 50% of the rostered players on the team.
