# Top of Inning 1:

Paul Vargo (sub) on the mound. Dan Shanahan leading off for the Tinters, sending a high pop that the 1<sup>st</sup> baseman loses in the sun. Jeff Vaca (sub) sends a high pop just over shortstop for another single. David Pryde sends a high pop to right that eludes the outfielder and scores Shanahan from 2<sup>nd</sup>. Left-handed hitter Bryan Bravard takes the count to 3-2 before driving it between 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, scoring Vaca. Sean Curry (sub) sends a hard shot to shortstop, but the throw eludes the 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman, scoring Shanahan and Pryde. Donna Nikisch (sub) scorches it past 3<sup>rd</sup> for a single. Tommy Gitchell sends a liner out to left, scoring courtesy runner Vaka for the 5<sup>th</sup> run of the inning.

# **Bottom of Inning 1:**

David Pryde on the hill for Home Tint. Kelly Wissink leading off, sending a line shot to center for her first hit. Aasha Jones follows suit and crushes it out to center field for a single. Greg Alexander draws a walk to load up the bases. Rick Ketring shoots a pop to Vaca in left center for the out but gets the sacrifice as Wissink races home. Steve Tafoya triples on a rocket to left, scoring Jones and Alexander. Allen Day shoots it between short and 3<sup>rd</sup>, scoring Tafoya. Another left-handed hitter, Steve Ward, sends an infield popup that no one can catch, but the runner is out at 2<sup>nd</sup> on a good throw by Pryde for the 2<sup>nd</sup> out. Richard Milby sends it to right for a single. Jay Wissink hits a smash to 3<sup>rd</sup>, but Curry makes the play and forces Milby out at second, keeping HDT's run total at 4. We got us a real nail-biter so far!!!

# Score after 1: HT 5 HDT 4

# Top of Inning 2:

David Ferneding is thrown out at 1<sup>st</sup> on a nice play by Alexander at short. Ron Frusher sends Alexander into a dive, but the throw to 1<sup>st</sup> is late resulting in a single. Eddie Feurst grounds to Alexander who throws to 2<sup>nd</sup> for the force out. Stewart Smith pops up to Alexander at short. All 3 putouts by Greg, no runs across for HT.

#### **Bottom of Inning 2:**

Stan Isbell leading off for HDT grounds to short and a strong throw gets the first out. Cheryl Soule singles to  $1^{st}$ . Paul Vargo takes the count to 3-2 before taking the  $3^{rd}$  strike for the  $2^{nd}$  out. Wissink up for her  $2^{nd}$  at bat, shoots it past  $2^{nd}$  for a single. Jones hits a hard grounder to  $3^{rd}$  for her  $2^{nd}$  hit loading the bases. Alexander grounds to short, who makes the throw to  $3^{rd}$  for the final out. No runs across for HDT.

# Score after 2: HT 5 HDT 4

### Top of Inning 3:

Mindy Shanahan leading off for HT grounds to Alexander for the first out. Greg is going for the record for the most consecutive putouts in RRSA history. Shanahan pops up to guess who for the 2<sup>nd</sup> out of the inning. Vaca takes a mighty hack at the first pitch, missing it completely, to the delight of the crowd, but then sends a smoking hot shot to center for a triple. Pryde grounds up the middle, scoring Vaca. Bravard shoots it past 1<sup>st</sup> for a single, sending Pryde around to 3<sup>rd</sup>. Curry pops up to Alexander. That's 6 in a row.

#### **Bottom of Inning 3:**

Ketring comes to the plate, and hoping to ignite a rally, smacks it over Vaca in left center for a stand up double. Tafoya does the same, sending it over Vaca's head and scoring Ketring, and then hustles home on some throws that just got away from the fielders. We'll call it a home run, cuz it's Robson Ranch softball. Tafoya is a single and double away from the cycle. Day makes it 3 out of 3, sending it over Vaca's head yet again. Ward gets just under the 2<sup>nd</sup> baseman's glove for a double, scoring Day from 2<sup>nd</sup>. Left-handed hitter Milby singles to right, scoring Ward. Wissink (the taller one) grounds to short for the force out at 2<sup>nd</sup>. Isbell singles to right, moving Wissink into 2<sup>nd</sup>. Soule (who always looks so serious but is a great hugger) singles to short, scoring Wissink for the 5<sup>th</sup> run.

Score after 3: HT 6 HDT 9

# Top of Inning 4:

Nikisch sends a shot to left for a single. Gitchell sends a high pop to center for a single. Ferneding looking for a trademark "Fernedinger", manages to hit it hard to left, scoring Nikisch and moving Gitchell around to 3<sup>rd</sup>. Frusher drops it over 2<sup>nd</sup> for a single, driving in Gitchell and moving Ferneding to 3rd. Fuerst drops it over short for an RBI and ties the game...runners on 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>. Smith grounds to Alexander (no, the record player isn't skipping) for the 1<sup>st</sup> out. Shanahan grounds into a 6-5-3 double play. So, technically, that's 8 straight put outs by Alexander, but his streak ends there as Greg decides to let someone else play defense and the 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman makes the throw to 1<sup>st</sup>.

# **Bottom of Inning 4:**

Vargo grounds out to short for the 1<sup>st</sup> out of the inning. Wissink (the shorter one) up for the top of the order again, grounds to 2<sup>nd</sup> for out #2. Jones gets another hit to left. Alexander (the Great) bashes a smash to left that eludes the fielder, and sprints around the bases for an inside the parker, scoring Jones in front for the 2<sup>nd</sup> run. Ketring lines to right for a single. Tafoya (searching for the cycle needing a single and double) fails miserably when he instead crushes it over the center field fence for a home run and brings in the 4<sup>th</sup> run of the inning. Day doubles over the head of Vaca (we've seen a lot of Jeff's back this game). Ward draws a walk to bring up Milby, who grounds to 1<sup>st</sup> to retire the side.

Sidebar: There seems to be a controversy afoot being discussed by those attending tonight's game regarding "juiced balls". Personally, this reporter is not sure that's something we ought to be discussing in the wholesome Robson Ranch co-ed atmosphere...so we'll leave that discussion to the RRSA board.

## Top of Inning 5:

Shanahan shoots it out to Milby in right center, who makes a nice catch for the first out. Vaca smashes one to center, but a second nice catch by outfielder Jones gets the 2<sup>nd</sup> out. Pryde parachutes one just over the 1<sup>st</sup> baseman's head for a single. Bravard ropes a single to right center for a single, and courtesy runner Vaca takes Bravard's place at 1<sup>st</sup>. Curry hopes to start a 2-out rally, and does, sending a single to left, scoring Pryde and Vaca all the way from first. Nikisch continues her hot night with a hard-hit single to center. Gitchell shoots it over the rover's head scoring Vaca (again) and moving Nikisch to 3<sup>rd</sup>. Ferneding grounds it to center scoring Nikisch. All tied up!!! "We got a game!" says Peter Day-Oh on the PA. Frusher pops out to Alexander, ending the HT threat.

# **Bottom of Inning 5:**

J Wissink steps up to start the 5<sup>th</sup> shooting it to center for a single. Isbell draws a walk to bring up Soule, who sends a shot to short stop, getting the 1<sup>st</sup> out at 3<sup>rd</sup> base. Vargo strikes out looking, putting the hopes for a big inning on the better half of the Wissink duo, who draws a walk and loads the bases for Jones. Jones grounds out to end the inning, no runs coming across.

This one is coming down to the wire (and hopefully not the end of my laptop's battery life).

Score after 5: HT 13 HDT 18

# Top of Inning 6:

Feurst is safe at first as he singles to the left side of the infield. Smith drops a hit in front of the center fielder. M Shanahan gives a mighty grunt to shoot a single past the 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman, scoring Fuerst and moving Smith to 3<sup>rd</sup>. The other Shanahan hustles into 2<sup>nd</sup> with a stand-up double, scoring Smith. Vaca sends a vicious high pop-up in front of the pitcher for a hustle single. If this were golf, it would have been a great chip shot from just off the green. Pryde crushes a stand-up double scoring 2 and capping the inning at 5 runs.

# **Bottom of Inning 6:**

Alexander lines out to short (what, he's human???) for the 1<sup>st</sup> out of the inning. Ketring shoots it under the 3<sup>rd</sup> baseman's glove for a double. Tafoya, who's greedy over the fence home run will probably keep him from hitting for the cycle, scorches one under the pitcher's glove for a double, scoring Ketring. If he only would have hit a single instead of a home run...oh the unrealized dreams ©. Day grounds to short, but a throw in the sun allows Tafoya to come around to score and Day moves into 2<sup>nd</sup>. Ward grounds just past 1<sup>st</sup> for a single. # Top of Inning 7:

Nikisch grounds to short who throws over to 2<sup>nd</sup> for the first out, scoring Frusher. Gitchell hits a fly ball caught by the left center fielder for the second out. Ferneding triples to deep center, scoring Nikisch. Frusher gets caught looking for the 3<sup>rd</sup> strike and final out of the inning.

# **Bottom of Inning 7:**

Vargo steps up, looking to ignite a rally that will yield at least 3 runs. But a nice play by Curry at 3rd just gets Vargo at first. K Wissink draws a walk to get things started with one out. Jones pops it up into shallow right, and hustles into 2<sup>nd</sup> with a stand-up double, moving Wissink to 3<sup>rd</sup>. Up steps you-know-

who...Alexander. And guess what! Foul ball for the 3<sup>rd</sup> strike. Pretty sure Jesus is coming back tonight. Up steps Gitchell who cranks it into left, tying the game at 20-20. Oh boy...Tafoya is up! Still a chance at the cycle with a single!
