3-0 After 1 Inning

9 - 4 After 4

Tommy Beauty ripped one down the 3rd base line bagging 2 more RBIs and then things got a little wonky. Aasha Jones drilled a nasty bouncer to 2nd which Carol Rumberger cleanly handled, and it was a race to 2nd base. Carol, SS Mike Moss and the runner Tommy Beaury all arrived about the same time, and it looked like a kerfuffle. Coco declared the runner 'safe'.
