12” CO-ED SOFTBALL RULES & REGULATIONS
(Updated 9/6/22)

Welcome to this season’s offering of Co-Ed slow-pitch softball. This will be a non-sanctioned, semi-competitive league. Games will be played on field #1 at Summerlakes Park- 3S010 Talbot Ave. The length of the regular season will be 5 regular season games.

The following pages contain the rules & regulations you will be playing under. Any rules not listed are found in the USA Softball Rulebook under Slow-Pitch listings. Some of the rules are formulated to meet the unique demands of the Park District facilities, time constraints and roster requirements. These rules are adhered to strictly by the Warrenville Park District. We ask that you read and go over these rules & regulations with your entire team.

I. Objective

A. To provide an opportunity for interested parties to play organized recreational softball. Fair play and sportsmanship is the responsibility of every player, manager, umpire, and spectator.

II. League Director – Dave Weiner

A. The League Director will handle all protests and matters of conduct within the league.

III. Registration Procedures

A. A \$100 non-refundable deposit must be submitted at time of registration. Failure to pay all fees in a timely manner may result in game forfeiture, suspension of non-resident players, and other appropriate penalties.

B. Accepted entries must provide the following:

1. Include a completed application form.
2. Include Team Rosters (due prior to your first game). Any Warrenville resident listed must be ready to submit proof of residency (copy of driver’s license). The Site Supervisor has the authority to ask for proof of residency at any time during the season.
3. Have resident team registration dues (due by the end of the captain’s meeting).

IV. Policies

- A. Teams are required to meet league payment deadlines, as well as roster and player identification deadlines, which are set by the Warrenville Park District.
- B. Any team member or captain submitting a check which is not negotiable due to insufficient funds, account closed, etc., will be assessed a \$25 administrative service fee and will jeopardize the team's position in the league. If satisfactory payment is not made immediately upon notification, then the team will be ejected from the league and a new team from the waiting list will be accepted.
- C. All money should be submitted directly to the park district registration office. The Site Supervisor will not be allowed to accept funds at the field.
- D. Rosters must have the captain and co-captain designated. A communication between the League Director and the teams will be relayed through the captains, or in lieu of the captain, the co-captain. Captains are responsible for relaying league rules and policies to their teammates. If rules and policies are not followed, teams will be penalized.
- E. A minimum of 12 and a maximum of 25 players are allowed per team.
- F. All players must be listed on the roster by the second game in order to be eligible for play during the remainder of the season. Also, address, phone number, emergency phone number, and signature should be listed for each player listed on the roster. Players must play in 2 regular season games to be eligible to play in the tournament. Once rosters have been turned in than no additional players will be allowed to be added to your roster.
- G. The Park District will provide an official scorekeeper, if possible. His/her score will be official. If no scorekeeper is present, the home team's score book is official.

V. Rosters and Line Ups

- A. All players must sign the team roster and be prepared to submit proof of identity and residence. All players should read the hold/harmless waiver on the reverse side of the roster form before signing the roster.
- B. A team must be able to place 8 players on the field at the official start of the game or they will forfeit. If both teams agree then you may begin a game hitting with 7 players.
- C. If a team has 11 or more players and wishes to bat all of them in order they may do so. The opponent does not have to do so. If a team bats more than 10 players at a time (bat around rule), they may substitute freely on defense. They are still restricted to playing 10 on defense at all times. A team that starts the game using the bat around rule must continue to use it throughout the game. A team must tell the umpire before the game that they are using this optional rule. Teams using this special rule will not be penalized if a player leaves the line up as long as at least 10 players are present. If there are two guys that bat back to back then this will equal an automatic out.
- D. A player who begins the season with a team will not be allowed to move to another team during the season without the league director's written approval.

- E. A team whose line-up falls below the minimum 8 players due to ejection will automatically forfeit.
- F. A team whose line-up falls below the minimum 8 players due to injury or personal emergency will be allowed to finish a game already in progress.
- G. Any team forfeiting 2 dates during the regular season will not be eligible to continue the season. They will not be eligible for the end of season tournament.
- H. A player must play in 2 regular season games in order to be eligible to participate in the end of season tournament.
- I. All players must be 18 years or older.
- J. There will be no player additions allowed once the team roster has been turned into the scorekeeper prior to the second game.

VI. Player Conduct

- A. A player who is ejected from the game for unsportsmanlike conduct is automatically suspended from the next game. A second violation will result in ejection from the League.
- B. Unsportsmanlike conduct can result in game forfeiture.
- C. A player receiving league ejection may not be replaced on the roster.
- D. A player being ejected for physical abuse will automatically be suspended from league play for one full year from the date of occurrence.
- E. No profanity or profane gestures will be tolerated. The umpire will be instructed to remove from the game any player whose actions and words are considered to be unsportsmanlike and abusive.
- F. Smoking within the fenced boundary of the field is not permitted.
- G. No alcoholic beverages are permitted on Park district property. Any player, team, or spectator that violates this rule will be suspended indefinitely from the league without a refund.
- H. All players, coaches, fans, and spectators are expected to abide by the Warrenville Park District's official Code of Conduct which governs behavior at all park district sponsored events.

VII. Rules

- A. Only 5 over the fence home runs per team per game and 2 per a person. If this is violated, then the penalty is a dead ball out. Also, if there are runners on base when a home run is hit then they are required to run the bases. The batter is not.
- B. A team must be able to place 8 players on the field at the official start of the game or they will forfeit. Should a team fall below this minimum number of players for any reason during the game, a forfeit will be called. Teams should always play with an equal number of men & women. A maximum of one extra player will be allowed. The team that is short a player will automatically receive an out.

- C. Any player arriving late must be placed at the bottom of the line-up for the current or next offensive inning. Defensively, players may enter whenever a break in play allows them to do so. Final decision will be made by the umpire.
- D. A re-entry rule will be in effect. Any player may enter, leave, and re-enter one time, provided the player occupies the same place in batting order. The beginning of the game counts as the first entry for starting players.
- E. A player who begins the season with a team will not be allowed to move to another team during the season.
- F. Batting order: Men & Women will bat in alternating order; for example, man, woman, man, woman etc. Everyone must bat.
- G. Fielding order: Outfield 2 men & 2 women. Infield: 2 men & 2 women. Battery: One each. **This rule can be waived only if both teams agree on this prior to the game beginning.**
- H. If a team has less than 8 players to start the game, they automatically become the visiting team and bat first. They must field their 8th player for their defensive half of the inning or they will forfeit.
- I. Any team forfeiting 2 games during the regular will not be eligible to continue the season. They will not be eligible for the league playoffs either and will not receive a refund.
- J. Teams may designate a player for whom a courtesy runner may be used. This should only take place if a player has a minor injury and cannot run at the umpire's discretion. The courtesy runner must be the player making the last batted out. The umpire must be made aware of this situation before the game. Men may not run for woman players. Only three players per a team can be made a courtesy runner.

VIII. The Game

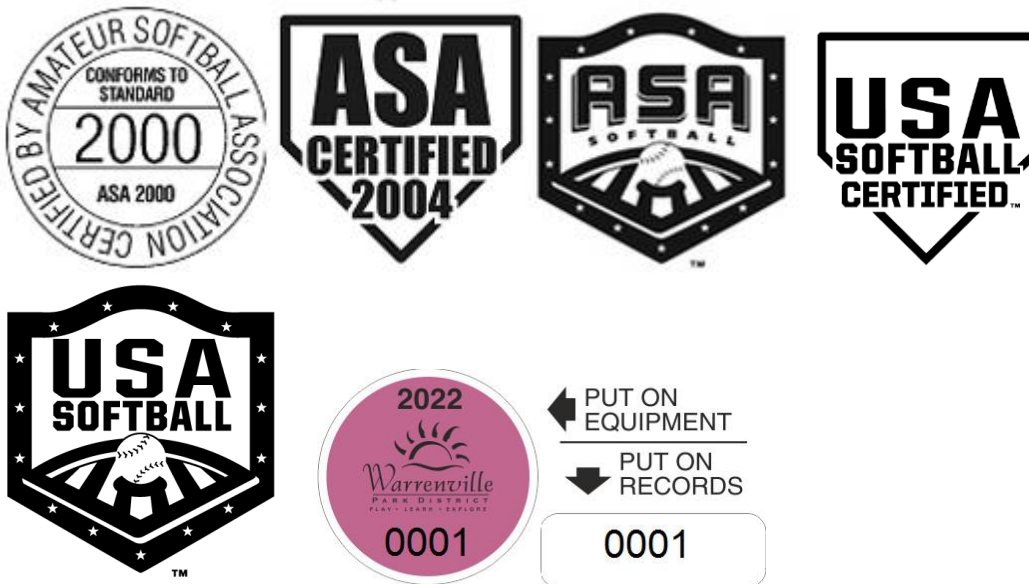
- A. In the event a team is ahead by 22 runs at the end of 3 innings, 18 after 4 innings, 12 after 5 innings or 10 after 6 innings, the game is declared over, (Slaughter Rule). The park district scorebook is official. If no park district scorekeeper is available, the home team scorebook is official. Teams should compare scores after each inning.
- B. Any game called by weather or curfew before 3 innings, or 45 minutes of play have been completed will be replayed. If the game is called by weather or by curfew during the 3rd, 4th, or 5th innings, or 45 minutes of play have been completed, the continuation of the game will be from the spot reached at the time the umpire called the game. A game called by the umpire shall be regulation once the visiting team has made 15 outs (five innings) and the home team is leading, or once the home team has made 15 outs regardless of score.
- C. One additional inning may be played if the score is tied at the end of seven innings and has occurred 45 minutes or earlier to break the tie. Each team will begin the inning with a runner on second base and one out. That runner will be the player who made the last out in the previous inning. This rule is designed to eliminate the likelihood of tie games.

D. Game time is forfeit time. However, the first game of the evening has a 10-minute grace period. Team captains cannot extend the game time. The umpire’s watch is official. A new inning will not start after 55 minutes of play. Time will be suspended at the umpire’s discretion for injury timeouts.

E. All softball bats used in league play must meet USA Softball regulations. The official bat, made up of the knob, handle, grip, taper, barrel and end cap shall be free of burs, dents, cracks, sharp edges, rattles, and show no signs of excessive wear. The official bat shall be marked official softball by the manufacturer and shall be no more than 34 inches long nor exceed 38 ounces in weight. The official bat shall not be more than 2.250 inches in diameter at its largest part, including any tolerance for expansion. The official bat must bear either the ASA 2000 Certification Mark, ASA 2004 Certification Mark, or ASA 2013 Certification Mark (see images below) and must not be listed on the ASA Non-Approved Bat List with 200 or 2004 Certification Mark (see images below) and must be included on a list of approved bat models published by USA Softball. These bats are strictly prohibited from league play.

Any bat used in gameplay will need to go through a bat test to deem if the bat is legal or illegal. Bat testing will only occur prior to the start of the game or at the captain’s meeting (not during gameplay). Bats that pass the test will have a blue Warrenville Park District sticker placed on them. Bats must have this sticker to be used during gameplay.

Any player using or attempting to use an altered bat will be immediately ejected from the game and called out. In the event the infraction is not noticed until after the ball has been put in play, the ball shall be declared dead and the batter out. If that player tries using the same bat again then an indefinite suspension will be given, team forfeit will occur, and the team may not be eligible to participate in the league for the remainder of the season. All bats will be checked by the scorekeeper prior to the game to ensure one of the ASA or USA stamps below is clearly marked on the bat and the green Warrenville Park District sticker is on the bat:



F. Bats shall not be thrown during the game. Player’s will be warned by the umpire the first time this happens. A second violation during the game will result in an immediate ejection of the player.

G. A Glove/Mitt may be worn by any player. The dimensions of any glove/mitt used by any fielder shall not exceed the specifications set forth below:

- Palm width (top) 8 in.
- Palm width (bottom) 8 1/2 in.
- Top opening of web 5 in.
- Bottom opening of web 4 1/2 in.
- Web top to bottom 7 1/4 in.
- 1st finger crotch seam 7 1/2 in.
- Thumb crotch seam 7 1/2 in.
- Crotch seam 17 1/2 in.
- Thumb top to bottom edge 9 1/4 in.
- 1st finger top to bottom edge 14 in.
- 2nd finger top to bottom edge 13 1/4 in.
- 3rd finger top to bottom edge 12 1/4 in.
- 4th finger top to bottom edge 11 in.

H. A strike mat will be used to determine balls and strikes. It will be a mat 2 ½ feet behind the plate and extended along the diagonal edges of the plate.

I. Base length will be 70ft. Pitcher rubber will be 50ft. from the plate.

J. There will be no marked batter's box. If batter steps on or over the plate to hit the ball (fair or foul) they will be out with no advancement of the runners.

K. Metal cleats will not be allowed.

L. Batters will start with 1 ball, 1 strike count.

M. Foul balls with a 2-strike count will be an out with advancement by any base runner at their own risk if the ball is caught.

N. No lead-offs allowed. No hesitation pitches allowed.

O. There will be no stealing allowed.

P. A runner may not crash into a fielder during any play. The runner will be called out for failing to avoid major contact and could possibly be ejected from the game if the umpire rules unsportsmanlike conduct. The fielder is not required to have secured the ball for this rule to be in effect, but the fielder may not block the base if he does not have the ball. This is a judgment call and is not subject to protest. Runner has four options: 1) avoid the collision, 2) stop, 3) slide, 4) retreat.

Q. Arc Rule –USA Softball pitching rules in effect - minimum of 6ft, maximum of 12ft. No step-offs allowed. Illegal pitch is a ball to batter. Pitcher needs to touch the pitching rubber either at the start of his pitch or during the follow through.

R. Only Warrenville Park District provided softball (Worth Softball, 300 lbs, .52 cor) will be allowed for gameplay.

S. Walk Rule- Walking a male batter with no strikes who directly proceeds an identified female spot in the batting order results in the male batter being awarded second base and the following female batter will be given a choice to walk or bat. If she chooses to bat then the male batter who walked in front of her will go to first base instead. If she chooses to walk, then the male batter will stay at second base.

T. Intentional walks are not allowed. You must make an effort to pitch to each and every hitter.

IX. Protest

A. The only legal protests are ones that involve a rule violation or the use of an ineligible player.

B. Use of an ineligible player must be brought to the attention of the umpire. At this time a roster check will be done by both captains with the umpire overseeing the process. Proof of identification must be produced. If proper identification cannot be produced, that player will be considered ineligible and the team will forfeit.

C. All protests must be made to the umpire prior to the next play.

D. A protest cannot be made concerning a judgment call by the umpire, i.e., ball, strike, fair, foul.

E. A protest must be submitted by letter or email by 6:30 p.m. on the following business day. The game will be played over from the point of infraction unless a forfeit is declared.

X. League Information

A. The Warrenville Park District reserves the right to suspend any team for not following the league rules. Suspension will be without refund.

B. Ties in the standings will be broken by run differential.

C. The League Director will draft all schedules and reschedule any games that are canceled due to weather.

D. There shall be no postponement of any game for any reason except in case of weather. In case of rain, please call (630) 454-6033 for information regarding games. Also, you may go to www.quickscores.com/warrenville, www.rainoutline.com (see separate rainout line document for instructions, or www.warrenvilleparks.org under the Weather Updates tab.

E. Make-Up Games may be scheduled on a night that you usually do not play on. We will try to schedule make-up games on the night you usually play on at the end of the season. If we fill these dates and times up you will be asked to make-up your game on another night.

F. The Warrenville Park District will post game results on www.quickscores.com/warrenville or www.warrenvilleparks.org under the Baseball/Softball Section. The park district and quickscores.com have created a website to post league standings, postseason tournament brackets, weather information, and league news and notes that will be regularly updated.

G. Field lights will be turned off no later than 10:30 pm per city ordinance.

XI. Responsibilities

- A. Captains and Co-Captains are the only team representatives allowed to act in an official capacity with the umpire and League Director. This will alleviate any problems concerning communication between the League office and the teams. If one of your players is acting out of line then it is your responsibility to immediately interject and calm the situation down.
- B. Before each game the team captains should review with the umpire all ground rules, pitching rules and submit roster line-ups to the scorekeeper.
- C. Captains are responsible for enforcing unsportsmanlike conduct rules (i.e. swearing, drinking alcohol, alcoholic containers, and/or abusive behavior). In most cases team captains will be warned one time by the League Director or umpire to control their team members before action is taken. This may include automatic forfeiture of the game and possibly league suspension.
- D. The team captains will be responsible for passing along all communications from the league office to their teammates.
- E. No Smoking is allowed inside the fences bordering the playing field.
- F. Finally, captains must stress to all players that this is a recreational league, and to show consideration for other players and league officials.
